



THE MARK OF A PROFESSIONAL CONSTRUCTION MANAGER

The Certified Construction Manager (CCM) is the “gold standard” in personnel credentials for the Construction Management profession. It is the only CM certification accredited by the American National Standards Institute (ANSI) under the International Organization for Standardization’s ISO 17024 standard.

The CM Certification Program is administered by the Construction Manager Certification Institute (CMCI), an independent administrative body of the Construction Management Association of America (CMAA).

CMCI recognizes the competency of an individual to perform as the lead role of a CM practitioner through the Certified CCM credentialing program.

Achieving the CCM indicates to owners and service providers that you have a mastery of specific skills required to successfully complete projects and programs.

The CCM also offers a credential that may increase professional stature, earning potential and advancement opportunities.

To apply for the CCM credential, applicants must have 48 months Responsible-In-Charge (RIC) experience and an undergraduate or masters degree from a university recognized by the Council for Higher Education Accreditation (CHEA) or 8 additional years of construction or general design experience.

Applicants approve for candidacy must successfully complete a 200 question multiple choice exam within a 5 hour timeframe based on the Construction Management Association of America (CMAA) “Standards of Practice” and the Construction Industry Institute’s (CII) “Best Practice’s Guide”.

The fees to become a CCM as of January 1st, 2014 are:

CMAA Member Application Fee: \$325

Non-CMAA Member Application Fee: \$425

Exam Fee: \$275

All certification fees are subject to change.
