The Construction Manager in Training (CMIT) Program is offered by the Construction Management Association of America to help young professionals launch and develop a successful career in the Construction Management industry.

The CMIT designation, which demonstrates competence in the practice of Construction Management early in an individual's career, is an invaluable tool for professional development.

### CMIT is for:

- Soon-to-be and recent graduates of accredited Engineering, Architecture or Construction Management degree programs
- Working graduate-degree candidates
- Early career individuals focused on pursuing the CCM credential by connecting with a CCM
- Experienced professionals dedicated to becoming a professional Construction Manager

## How to Become a CMIT:

- Submit an online application
- Meet one of the eligibility requirements (shown right)
- Complete the online Capstone Self-Study (The History of Construction Management Practices and Procedures)
- Score at least 80% on the self-administered multiple choice test
- Connect with a CCM Mentor

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## Eligibility Requirements:

To qualify for CMIT, an applicant must meet one of the following criteria relative to education and experience:

- Bachelor's or Master's degree in Engineering, Architecture or Construction Management
- 75 credit hours toward a Bachelor's degree in an Engineering, Architecture or Construction Management program
- Associate's degree or certificate in Engineering, Architecture or Construction Management
- At least four years of general design/construction experience
